





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



On Thursday evening, April 18, 2019, SCWDC conducted its annual Election for the offices of Club President and Directors (at least 4 positions). I ran unopposed and was elected to a second term as SCWDC President. I am looking forward to building on the progress we made in the past year and continuing to make substantive improvements during the rest of my term of office.

Leo Boelhouwer, Donna Harris, Mary-Jo Swinimer and David Toms were elected to serve 2-year terms as a Club Director. At the first meeting of the Board of Directors immediately following the election, Leo Boelhouwer was elected by the Board to continue serving as the Club's Vice President, a position in which he has served with distinction for several years.

All three of the proposed changes to the Club's Bylaws and Rules of Procedure were approved by substantial margins. Details of these changes can be seen on the website page entitled "2019 SCWDC Election".

This year the Club implemented electronic voting for the first time. Voting numbers increased substantially, with over 200 ballots cast online. The volunteer effort involved was also greatly reduced, as the number of paper and absentee ballots decreased significantly. The implementation was a learning experience, and several "dry runs" were used to fine-tune and document the process and administrative details.

The Club had a very successful year leading up to the election. Our Ski Flight Trips, Tennis and Recreational Travel programs all had very good years. Overall, we finished the year with a very small profit, a desirable outcome for a nonprofit organization such as ours, and which is indicative of good management and planning

This time of year is very busy for the Club's leadership team. As I write this message, we just successfully completed our annual Audit, and will now need to implement suggestions for stronger financial controls and administrative oversight. The Club continues to be in very strong shape financially. Our next task is to review, update, and approve the annual budget for FY20. Our goal is to continue to streamline our administrative processes, cut costs, and keep event prices as low as possible while keeping services and quality as high as possible.

Our Ski Flight Trips Committee has finalized contracts for the 2020 ski season, and ski trip prices and trip leader names will be announced soon. A tremendous amount of work needs to be completed in the next few weeks to get all our ski trips posted onto the website, along with pricing details and payment schedules. As in previous years, we hope to begin accepting online registrations and trip deposits by the July 4 weekend. Stay tuned for details.



Hey, when is the SCWDC Ski Fest this year? What, no Ski Fest? Well, sorta yes, sorta no. Due to expense and other circumstances, the Ski Fest has had its run and is retired. What we plan to have in place of the Ski Fest is a members' party to celebrate the upcoming ski season, the Back to the Slopes Party.

What: Back to the Slopes Party

Where: Tyson's Biergarten, 8346 Leesburg Pike, Tysons, VA 22182

When: Sunday, September 15, 2019, 4 p.m. - 8 p.m.

Price: FREE EVENT but food and beverage are available at a deep discount (**"TWO FOR ONE"** food/beverage tokens) Members pay \$10, non-members pay \$15.

- Attendance and registration are free. Register and receive one door prize raffle ticket
- Register and purchase discounted 2 for 1 food/beverage ticket and receive two door prize raffle tickets
 - Grand Prize will be a Club Med 3 Day Weekend Getaway for Two! However, for this grand prize, there may be a bit of a reindeer game to select a winner among the 5 finalists. It would likely be trivia questions or a game of skill or both.

Food tokens: One food token entitles you to a food order. Each food order includes 2 items of choice plus 2 sides, with and without bread. Menu includes vegetarian options.

Beverage tokens: One beverage token entitles you to a beverage order. Tysons Biergarten offers 140+ types of beer, 50+ types of Whiskey/Bourbon/Scotch. Wine is also available, as are non-alcoholic beverages.

Like the Ski Fest, there will be SCWDC trip leaders, trip displays, and ski industry friends' displays/exhibits. Like the Ski Fest, there will be music, and raffle prizes. Unlike the Ski Fest, the Back to the Slopes Party will be outside at a Bier Garten, with picnic tables, pop-up tent canopies, and discounted, 2 for 1 beverage/food tokens available for purchase. We are arranging with our ski industry friends to exhibit their products and services like they would at a ski resort Ski Demo Day, to generate that ski season vibe. All the details have not been worked out yet but be prepared to be surprised at this fun members' event. Of course, invite friends and family to check out this party. Consult our website at scwdc.wildapricot. org for details as they develop. Look for notices in our weekly SkiGram. Put Sunday, September 15, on your calendar. For those who are familiar with the location of the old Ski Chalet, on the service road off Leesburg Pike, down the road from the old Tysons Corner Clyde's, you will know where the Tyson's Biergarten is located. There is a parking lot in front, as well as a paid parking lot next door, for which we will be provided parking vouchers. For those who will Metro to the party, Tyson's Biergarten is literally located a few dozen steps from the Greensboro Metro Station.

It's almost here. Time to break out your winter gear and prepare for some winter fun. That's right, it's time to get **BACK TO THE SLOPES**. Ski season starts HERE!

SAILING



Sailing lessons for the 2019 sailing season will be held later in the season this year, instead of our usual Spring-time schedule. If you're interested in learning to sail, make sure you join us for a Potomac Sail, held each Tuesday evening, and every other Saturday.

Watch for our Centerboard and Keel Boat classes in the SkiGram and on the Ski Club Website.





We sail on the Potomac every Tuesday evening from 6 – 8 p.m. (earlier beginning in late August) and every other Saturday morning from 10 a.m. to noon from Belle Haven Marina (www.saildc.com). Belle Haven is located on the George Washington Parkway just south of the Wilson Bridge. [Note: This is NOT the marina next to National Airport.] Turn off the Parkway at the Belle Haven Marina sign and follow the road until you see the boats and water, then park. The group meets outdoors, at or near the picnic tables by the marina's office trailer.

No experience is necessary. We sail very stable, 19' Flying Scots, each of which has an experienced skipper and often experienced crew. You can go along for the ride or enhance your sailing instruction by participating in boat handling. Our skippers are also excellent teachers and will provide guidance to all interested in learning. After the sails, all hungry sailors adjourn to a local Greek/American restaurant, Primo's, where we enjoy lunch or dinner in the back room (separate cost).

Dress is casual and based on the temperature. Layering is suggested since it's often cooler on the water than on land. Occasionally you may get splashed, and the water in the spring can be cool. There is a restroom if you need to change clothes after work. Sun block, water, hats, and croakies to keep your glasses on your head, are also recommended. **Reservations are strongly encouraged** – and the only way to guarantee a place on a boat. We reserve the number of boats and confirm our skippers based on the number of people who have signed up 3 days in advance. To reserve, call the trip leader listed below, on the web site, or in the SkiGram; the latter options will have updated information in case there are changes. If you get a machine, leave your name, phone number, number of people in your group, and the date of the sail; please repeat your name and number slowly. Plan to be at the marina at least 15 minutes before the sailing time. The marina is very busy

on Saturday mornings and you may have to walk from a distant parking lot so allow enough time. The trip leader will collect money, assign people to boats, and get everyone on the water. Exact change, or checks made payable to Belle Haven Marina, are appreciated.

If you can't make it at the last minute, please call the trip leader, leaving a message if necessary. That way we can check our messages if you don't show up and give your space to someone who did. If you have a last-minute chance to sail, call the trip leader or come by to see if there's room. We can't guarantee it, but we'll try to accommodate you if possible.

If the weather is questionable, call the marina at 703-768-0018 an hour before the scheduled sailing time to see if they're allowing boats to go out. The wind can be very different on the river from other areas, so don't assume there's too much or too little wind to sail. Sometimes we can't decide about the weather until we get to the marina. If you come and we can't sail, we'll head to Primo's early.

If you have experience as a small boat sailor and would like to possibly be a skipper, please contact Bernie Joiner at 703-560-2203 or choosri@aol.com to arrange a check-out. He will schedule it during one of our regular sails.

Basic Small Boat (Centerboard) Sailing Lessons



This course will teach you to take a small centerboard boat out in protected waters like the Potomac River, a lake or near shore in moderate conditions. It is taught on four mornings at Belle Haven Marina, and also includes two evening classroom sessions in Vienna. You will learn how to:

- Steer and maneuver the boat
- Trim the sails
- Dock
- Tack and head up
- Jibe and fall off
- Safety skills
- Tie nautical knots
- Adjust sails for wind conditions
- Nautical terminology and boat parts
- Safely right the boat from a capsize

Graduates will be qualified to skipper small sail boats and be awarded the American Sailing Association Basic Small Boat Sailing Certification (ASA 110). In order to accommodate this year's students, we have not set the dates of the class – **but offer you a chance to set the dates**.

We need to have classes during two consecutive weeks, with one evening class followed by the weekends for morning sailing. For example, Monday

evening class and Saturday and Sunday morning sails on two consecutive weeks before November. If you would like to suggest dates, contact Bernie Joiner at choosri@aol.com, or 703-560-2203. We need to reserve the boats and coordinate by the first of September, so let us know as soon as you can. The cost will be \$170 for members and \$185 for non-members (includes textbook, exam & boat rental - but instruction is FREE).






