



GOOD, COED, PICK-UP VOLLEYBALL — Players are invited to our Monday evening, drop-in, coed volleyball. (We do NOT play on Monday federal holidays.)

Play on our A-level court is quite competitive. They play 5/1 volleyball with a floating setter and a three-person attack at the net.

Don't know what that means? Consider our intermediate court.

On the intermediate court, we play by the rules, and we all rotate through the setter's position. We try to take all three hits before returning the ball. Here are the key questions: Can you bump? Can you set? If your answers are "yes", come and play with us. Rusty players are always welcome! Really, we're pretty accepting on the "B" court.

Currently, we are not offering a beginner's-level court. But, if you organize a group of friends, we will offer free instruction on the basics of volleyball.

We have three courts, so waiting time between games is quite short. On many nights, play is continuous. JUST SHOW UP. You'll be in a game, typically, in less than ten minutes.

Indoor Tennis Parties (Best Deal in Town)

Ski Club Indoor Tennis parties are held almost every Saturday night from October through April. Tennis parties provide competitive social doubles and mixed doubles, where players enjoy good tennis, mingle, and enjoy a light buffet and beverages.

Who is eligible to attend?

Parties are for adults over 21 years of age who are experienced intermediate players (NTRP 2.5 to 4.5 or higher). If you are not sure of your numerical rating, please review the USTA's National Tennis Rating Program (NTRP) guidelines National Tennis Rating Program (to discuss your level, contact Jack Tarr (jtarr5@verizon.net). Attendance is typically a mix of active singles and couples from their late 20's to 60's. Parties average 64 players each week. but some have up to 80 in attendance. Male/female split is close to 50/50 at each party. Newcomers and non-SCWDC members are welcome. Non-players are also welcome, just pay \$10 at the door and you can eat, drink, and socialize.

Where & when are the parties held?

Most tennis parties are held at Fairfax Racquet Club in Virginia. Three parties will be held at Georgetown Prep Tennis Club in Maryland this season. Check-in begins at 6:15 p.m., and scheduled tennis play is from 7 p.m. to 11 p.m. Please allow for traffic delays to ensure arrival on time. If you arrive after 7:30 p.m. you may be replaced by a standby, and will forfeit the entire party cost. You can register for each party in advance, and pay online. SCWDC members pay \$20, non-members pay \$25.

CRUISING & BIKING THE MOLDAU & ELBE RIVERS IN PRAGUE

With Optional Extension to Dublin, Ireland

The "Heart of Europe" is a good description of the destination for our next Bike & Barge adventure. The region formerly known as "Bohemia" evokes exotic culture, customs, and history; not just for its resplendent cities, but also for its villages and country-side. Our starting and ending point is the city of Prague, one of the few large cities whose buildings, monuments, and culture were spared from the devastation that WWII brought to the rest of civilized Europe.
