### SCWDC presents Ski Hakuba Valley, Japan, BRSC AsiaFest, Feb. 21-29, 2019

Hakuba Valley is at the heart of the spectacular Japanese Alps and just 5 hours from downtown Tokyo by private bus. Host to the 1998 Winter Olympic Games, Hakuba is one of Japan's largest and most renowned alpine resorts. The valley consists of 10 ski resorts, giving an incredible variety of alpine terrain, accommodating everyone from novice to expert. With this many ski resorts to choose from the slopes are relatively empty during the week and fresh tracks can be found for days. You'll never be short of new areas to explore.

You'll like the Hakuba Valley ski trip for its mix of skiing, snowboarding, cross country, snowshoeing, delicious food, rural and urban cultural experiences. All levels of skiers and snowboarders are welcome. You don't need to be an advanced or expert skier or snowboarder to have a good time on this ski trip. However, if you are an expert, you won't be disappointed because there is terrain for everyone. Ski the resort or if the conditions are right there are plentiful back-country options. Spend time with the group or do your own thing. Hakuba valley offers many restaurants and nightlife options. There are tons to explore.



We are staying at the 5 ★ Hotel Tokyu. It is a short walk to Happo-One ski resort, one of 10 ski resorts available on

Hakuba Valley All Mountain Pass. Lift tickets are not included in the price, to accommodate Epic Pass holders, non-skiing/cultural participants, and flexible ski days. One day, walk-up lift ticket prices are about \$45 to \$50. Ski everyday or mix and match ski days and cultural tour days.

After a day of skiing/snowboarding, cross country skiing, snow shoeing, or sight seeing, you can enjoy the hotel's Onsen (natural hot spring pool). No need for hot tubs.

The hotel is also located a short distance from the <u>Evergreen</u> <u>Outdoor Center</u>, your source for ski/snowboard/park lessons



and backcountry guides (back country tours from the alpine towering above Hakuba to some of the worlds best tree runs, snowshoe tours, evening snowshoe fondue tours and cross country tours on Olympic courses and forest trails).

Optional daily excursions are available from the hotel or nearby transportation center. Excursion possibilities include Jigokudani Monkey Park (Snow Monkeys), local sake distillery and microbrewery tour, and exploring Zenkoji Temple, one of the oldest and most important Buddhist temples in the country.

### **Resort:**







#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - Organization and Summary of Accounting Policies

The Ski Club of Washington, D.C. ("the Club") is a non-profit organization established for the social and recreational benefit of its members. The organization was started in 1936 and recognized by the IRS as a tax exempt organization in 1963. Its primary sources of funds are from membership dues and activity fees collected from the participating members. The Club conducts over 150 ski, recreation or social events and activities for its members each year.

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies followed in the preparation of these

- a) Basis of Accounting The Club prepares its financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, which involves the application of accrual accounting consequently, revenues and gains are recognized when earned, and expenses and losses are recognized when incurred.
- b) Basis of Presentation The Club is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. The Club has no temporarily restricted or permanently restricted net assets.
- c) Support and Expenses Contributions received and unconditional promises to give are measured at their fair values and are reported as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the castionee and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished) in the reporting period in which the revenue is recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily restricted or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted are assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets are related from restrictions.

- d) Statement of Cash Flows The Club considers substantially all highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.
- e) Use of Estimates The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.
- f) Concentration of Credit Risk The Club occasionally maintains deposits in excess of federally insured limits. These items are identified as a concentration of credit risk requiring disclosure, regardless of the degree of risk. The risk is managed by maintaining all deposits in high quality financial institutions. The Club has not experienced any losses on its cash accounts.

- g) Income Taxes The Club is a nonprofit organization exempt from income taxes under Section Income Taxes — The Club is a nonprotit organization exempt from income taxes univer Section 50(c/f) of the Internal Revenue Code on all income other than unrelated business income. The Club has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation. Unrelated business income, from non-members, advertising and interest income, for the years ended April 30, 2018 and 2017 totaled 51,528 and \$710 respectively. Federal and state income tax expense for the years ended April 30, 2018 and 2017 was \$4 and \$8, respectively.
- h) Uncertain Tax Positions As of April 30, 2018, the Club had no uncertain tax positions that qualify for either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The tax years subject to examination by the taxing authorities are the years ended April 30, 2015 through 2017.
- i) Accounts Receivable Accounts receivable are reported net of an allowance for uncollectible accounts. The allowance for uncollectible receivables is provided based on management's evaluation of uncollectible accounts at year end. The accounts receivable balance on the statement of financial position consists of receivables from members for activities completed during the fiscal year and a tour company. The allowance for doubtful accounts as of April 30, 2018 and 2017 were \$-0- and \$-5, respectively. Bad debt expense for the years ended April 30, 2018 and 2017 were \$-0- and \$5,750, respectively.
- Property and Equipment Purchased property and equipment are recorded at cost for any item in excess of \$500. Contributed property and equipment is recorded at its fair market value on the date of contribution. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged against income as incurred; betterneats, which increase the value or materially extend the life of the related assets, are

Depreciation and amortization expense is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets. Depreciation expense for the years ended April 30, 2018 and 2017 were \$1,624 and \$4,462, respectively. The estimated useful lives are:

Furniture and Equipment 1 to 10 years
Building 35 years

Advertising Cost – Advertising costs are expensed when incurred. Advertising expense for the years ended April 30, 2018 and 2017 were \$-0- and \$-0-, respectively.

NOTE 2 -- Donated Services and Materials

A number of unpaid volunteers have made contributions of their time in conjunction with the activities the Club conducts. The value of these contributions is not included in these financial statements, since they do not require specialized skills and are not susceptible to objective

NOTE 3 - Prepaid Membership Dues

Club members have the option to purchase their membership in increments of one year, three years, five years, ten years or life. Prepaid membership dues are recognized over the duration of membership. Life memberships have an estimated duration of 25 years. The prepaid membership dues will be recognized

NOTE 4 - Lease Revenue and Subsequent Events

The Club has an operating lease agreement to lease the top floor of its office condo, which expires in January 31, 2020. The lease calls for monthly lease payments of \$1,336 through January 31, 2019 and annual increases thereafter. For the years ended April 30, 2018 and 2017, lease income was \$16,035 and \$15,916, respectively.
